

Pastor's Corner

13 And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these

- 1 Corinthians 13:13

"I will greet this day with love in my heart". This is how author Og Mandino begins scroll number two in his best-selling book "The Greatest Salesman in the World".

The author goes on to describe love as an invisible power that opens up hearts and turns enemies into friends.

Of loving others, he writes "Always will I dig for reasons to applaud; never will I scratch for excuses to gossip" (Easier said than done!). Of loving life's circumstances, he writes "I will welcome happiness for it enlarges my heart; yet I will endure sadness for it opens my soul."

Mandino opens the final paragraph of the scroll with the phrase "Most of all I will love myself." I find this to be a helpful reminder that in the busyness of serving others, it is important to care for ourselves. One African proverb states "To be able to love other people you must be able to love yourself". The Bible says to love your neighbor as yourself... not instead of yourself!

Yes, love can be expressed outwardly in many ways. Love is shown in the giving of flowers, candies and valentine's cards. In helping someone in need. In saying a silent prayer for a stranger who'll never know about it. We also demonstrate love when we accept our own flaws, forgive ourselves of past mistakes and when we take that much needed "me" time.

1 Corinthians 13 reminds us that love is more than a feeling of affection. Love is a great call to action. A call to care well for those around us and for ourselves.

May we greet this day and every day with God's love in our hearts.

Did You Know that Abbeville Has a Homeless Problem?



Anthony Price, Director of Pathway House in Greenwood that deals with homelessness and Elizabeth Crocker, Coordinator of Secondary Programs with Abbeville County School District spoke to the UCMAC Board recently about the homeless problem in Abbeville County. The problem on paper as estimated by HUD and US Dept. of Education does not appear to be that bad but in reality the actual numbers are much greater. Price said, "studies tell us that homelessness is typically 6-10 times higher than what figures indicate."

Crocker stated that families do all they can to hide being homeless for fear that DSS will take their children away. Crocker's role is to try to identify these families and supply resources that will provide them safety and the ability to stay together. She has identified 42 students as homeless.

Price says he is aware of at least 61 homeless people in Abbeville County. UCMAC often serves homeless and having another resource like Riley & Carolin Ann McLane Pathway House to refer folks to is guite a blessing.
