Pastor's Corner

I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth. He will not let your foot be moved; he who keeps you will not slumber... The Lord will keep you from all evil, he will keep your life. The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time forth and forevermore. Psalm 121:1-3:7-8

I was once questioned by the FBI because one of my college roomates was hired for a position at the White House on the Vice-President's photography team. Such a position meant they had to thoroughly investigate his life, and talk with anyone who had ever had anything of consequence to do with him. We were only roomates for a about 6 months but I had to meet with an FBI agent and share everything I knew. I had to answer every question posed to me with as much detail as I could give in order to help provide the highest level of protection for the Vice-President and ultimately for the President of the United States.

That got me thinking about all that goes into protecting the president and how many people "guard" the president when he travels. That is an almost impossible question to answer. The reason is because whenever the president travels a Secret Service security team goes into action months ahead of time. They pour over every possible detail in order to anticipate every possibility. The involve all levels of law enforcement. The work of protecting the president is not about how many people are surrounding him as he gets off Air Force One or how many walk with him into a building. His protection is practically speaking beyond measure, beyond the possibility of one mind to comprehend. The thoroughness of such an endeavor would be impossible except that thousands of people are working on it constantly. His protection is always top priority.

Now, that's pretty amazing, but the writer of Psalm 121 would say that as great as that level of protection is it doesn't come close to the protection we receive. Psalm 121 is all about how the Lord is not only the one who made the heavens and the earth, but He is the One who protects us each and every day of our lives. He is to his people a source of protection greater than anything the secret service, or any body guard could offer. He's the one who sees the end from the beginning. He can and does protect us like no one else.

Now, having said all of that, we all know the Lord's people come to all manner of physical harm. There have been lots of people who have died while serving the Lord. Some from persecution, and some from disease and illness. That didn't mean the Lord wasn't watching over them. He was in fact watching over their life, their going out and coming in even as they joined that great cloud of witnesses in the heavens. He was and continues to be their great shepherd, and He is our strong tower of refuge. He is our strength. Where does our help come from? Our help comes from the Lord, the maker of heaven and earth. I hope as you consider your life and service you'll remember God's great protection over you.
